THE STORY OF SNOW WHITE

Act 1

A King's joy at the birth of his daughter is tempered by the loss of his wife, who dies shortly after. In time, his daughter, Princess Snow White, grows up to be beautiful in all regards, notably her heart. As she comes of age, the King is introduced to a beguiling woman who becomes his Queen. She has a dark secret, envy for anyone more beautiful than she. To make sure that she is the most beautiful, she consults her Magic Mirror, which is able to tell her whether she is the most beautiful in the whole kingdom.

After marrying the King, she finds she is not the most beautiful in the kingdom, but Snow White is. The Queen forces the King's Huntsman to take Snow White into the forest and kill her. As the Huntsman is about to complete his task, he is filled with remorse and cannot bring himself to kill Snow White. He sends her into the forest and tells her to never return to the palace. Snow White does as he tells her and finds herself lost in the forest. She is found by a family of deer who lead her to a curious cottage deep in the forest. Though Snow White does not find anyone home, she does find food and drink. Once she partakes of them, she falls asleep.

Snow White is awakened by seven strangers. After introducing herself she tells her new friends of her plight. They decide that she can remain with them in exchange for cooking meals and cleaning.

Act 2

Learning that Snow White is in fact not dead, the Queen brings her gargoyles to life to help her find and take care of Snow White herself.

Meanwhile, Snow White is happily living with the Dwarfs. She does her tasks while enjoying playing with the wildlife around the cottage. Suddenly all is disrupted by a black cloud that turns into the Queen's Gargoyles. When an old peddler woman appears, Snow White offers her a place to sit and cup of water. The woman gives Snow White the most beautiful apple she has ever seen.

The Dwarfs return from work just in time to see Snow White take a bite then collapse. The Dwarfs rush towards the old woman, who transforms into the Evil Queen, throws them back and escapes with her Gargoyles. The Dwarfs rush to Snow White. Though not dead, she does not awaken. They build a bier to place her on and cover her with a veil. The Dwarfs watch over Snow White for a full year. A Prince who was out hunting meets a herd of Deer that seem to be trying to tell him something. As he follows them, they lead him to the Dwarfs' cottage, where he finds Snow White and the Dwarfs.

The Prince asks the Deer what to do and realizes that a kiss will awaken her. His kiss doesn't awaken her, but when he lifts her up, the poisoned apple falls out of Snow White's mouth and she wakens. Everyone is overioved at this turn of events.

The Dwarfs are determined to make the Queen pay for her evil deed and march off to the castle with Snow White and the Prince following. They catch up to the Queen and her Gargovles on the road to the castle. The queen rushes to her chamber to ask for assistance from the Magic Mirror, only to find that the Mirror has a different plan. Snow White and her protectors arrive just as the Queen is pulled into the Mirror and disappears. The Mirror sees Snow White and is so pleased to see how much Snow White has grown up and shares a secret with Snow White: she is indeed the image of her Mother.

Act 3

A grand celebration is planned for the return and marriage of Snow White. The King has forgiven his Huntsman and welcomes the Dwarfs to his kingdom. After the marriage ceremony Snow White and the Prince have their first dance...and they all lived happily ever after.


ABOUT THE BALLET

Artistic Director Karl von Rabenau



As a youth **Karl von Rabenau** studied at Minnesota Ballet Academy, then danced with the Ballet as an apprentice.

He further studied at Minnesota Dance Theatre, San Francisco Ballet, and Boston Ballet. He danced with Boston Ballet II, Boston Ballet as apprentice, Omaha Ballet, Central Pennsylvania Youth Ballet, Pittsburgh Ballet Theatre, and finished his performing career as soloist for ten years with the Milwaukee Ballet. Mr. von Rabenau danced in such works as George Balanchine's Serenade and Four Temperaments; Michael Smuin's The Tempest; José Limón's Moor's Pavane; Choo San Goh's In the Glow of the Night; and Bruce Wells' Romeo and Juliet. Mr. von Rabenau's choreography has been performed by Milwaukee Ballet and in Regional Dance America festivals. With his wife, Jennifer Miller, he cofounded and served as Co-Director of Lake Arts Project in Milwaukee, an arts collaboration bringing dance and other art forms together for the benefit of both participants and observers. For the Minnesota Ballet, his Nutcracker: A Duluth Tale won the praise, "Minnesota Ballet's 'Nutcracker' Delivers New Take on Christmas Classic."



Ballet Master Jennifer Miller

Jennifer Miller brings 30 years of professional experience to her position as Ballet Master. She enjoys working closely

with Artistic Director Karl von Rabenau, assisting in teaching and coaching for performances. She is also Coordinator for Minnesota Ballet Academy. Ms. Miller received formal training from the Central Pennsylvania Youth Ballet under the tutorage of Marcia Dale Weary, then at the Joffrey Ballet and San Francisco Ballet. At the Milwaukee Ballet she rose to Principal Artist, dancing in featured roles in such ballets as Swan Lake, The Nutcracker, Romeo and Juliet, Hunchback of Notre Dame; and works by Trey McIntyre, Choo San Goh, David Parsons, Antony Tudor, Lila York, Margo Sappington, Alvin Ailey, Bruce Wells, and Michael Pink. After retiring from the stage, she served on the faculty at the Milwaukee Ballet School & Academy. She also taught for Central Pennsylvania Youth Ballet for more than 25 years. As choreographer, Ms. Miller has created works for the Milwaukee Ballet, Milwaukee Ballet II, Central Pennsylvania Youth Ballet, Point Park University's International Summer Dance, Dance Arts Center and Erie Dance Conservatory.



Principal Teacher LilaAnn Coates White

LilaAnn Coates White has been a part of Minnesota Ballet since she was twenty years old, as a company mem-

ber, Principal Teacher of Minnesota Ballet Academy, choreographer and rehearsal assistant for both the company and school, and Artistic Associate. Lila has worked under five artistic directors and has staged and rehearsed portions of The Nutcracker, Swan Lake, Coppélia, and Giselle. She has taught all levels of ballet and pointe as well as character, men's class, dance history, repertoire, and choreography workshops. To celebrate her 25th anniversary as Principal Teacher, Lila created a Grand Défilé for the Student performance and a Tribute to the Academy for the Ballet's 50th Anniversary Gala. Lila has choreographed numerous pieces for the Minnesota Ballet including "Precarious" and "Appasionato" and "Scenes from a Supper Club". Lila is an Assistant Professor of Dance at the University of Minnesota Duluth and holds a B.A. in Health Sciences and an M.A. in Physical Therapy. She has choreographed for UMD productions, American College Dance Association, Dances on the Lake-walk, Lyric Opera of the North, and Arrowhead Chorale.
