### The Pit and the Pendulum

The Accused has been sentenced to death during the Inquisition. Upon receiving his death sentence, he fights, cries, and pleads for mercy. He finds himself trapped and alone, in complete darkness where he is afraid that he has been locked in a tomb. He has been tortured and is dangerously close to his death, so close that he can see her and feel her. The appeal of Death is overwhelming. The only thing that can snap him out of his despair is the carnal need of food.

As he eagerly consumes some of the food, the Accused is surprised to find he has cellmates, oddly resembling disfigured rats sneaking out of the shadows and swarming around his food. The Accused is relieved to not be alone for now, and gladly shares his food in exchange for companionship.

The fast friends' denial of the dark reality of their situation is swept away by this pleasant moment. It is abruptly interrupted by the Judges, who are ready for the next execution. They drag one unlucky rat to the pit, who becomes the first to be executed for the day... death by pendulum. While traumatized by witnessing the gruesome event, the Accused is chosen by the Judges to be the next victim. Upon being prepared for execution the Accused is again alone and under the spell is Death. This time Death feels inevitable and he is ready to give in. The surviving rats come to his rescue, freeing the Accused from his bonds. They get frantically close to escaping when they are discovered by the Judges, who seize the Accused and once again prepare him for his ultimate demise.



## Artistic Director **Karl von Rabenau**

As a youth **Karl von Rabenau** studied at Minnesota Ballet Academy, then danced with the Ballet as an apprentice.

He further studied at Minnesota Dance Theatre, San Francisco Ballet, and Boston Ballet. He danced with Boston Ballet II, Boston Ballet as apprentice, Omaha Ballet, Central Pennsylvania Youth Ballet, Pittsburgh Ballet Theatre, and finished his performing career as soloist for ten years with the Milwaukee Ballet. Mr. von Rabenau danced in such works as George Balanchine's Serenade and Four Temperaments; Michael Smuin's The Tempest; José Limón's Moor's Pavane; Choo San Goh's In the Glow of the Night; and Bruce Wells' Romeo and Juliet. Mr. von Rabenau's choreography has been performed by Milwaukee Ballet and in Regional Dance America festivals. With his wife, Jennifer Miller, he cofounded and served as Co-Director of Lake Arts Project in Milwaukee, an arts collaboration bringing dance and other art forms together for the benefit of both participants and observers. For the Minnesota Ballet, his Nutcracker: A Duluth Tale won the praise, "Minnesota Ballet's 'Nutcracker' Delivers New Take on Christmas Classic."



## Ballet Master **Jennifer Miller**

Jennifer Miller brings 30 years of professional experience to her position as Ballet Master. She enjoys working closely

with Artistic Director Karl von Rabenau, assisting in teaching and coaching for performances. She is also Coordinator for Minnesota Ballet Academy. Ms. Miller received formal training from the Central Pennsylvania Youth Ballet under the tutorage of Marcia Dale Weary, then at the Joffrey Ballet and San Francisco Ballet. At the Milwaukee Ballet she rose to Principal Artist, dancing in featured roles in such ballets as Swan Lake, The Nutcracker, Romeo and Juliet, Hunchback of Notre Dame; and works by Trey McIntyre, Choo San Goh, David Parsons, Antony Tudor, Lila York, Margo Sappington, Alvin Ailey, Bruce Wells, and Michael Pink. After retiring from the stage, she served on the faculty at the Milwaukee Ballet School & Academy. She also taught for Central Pennsylvania Youth Ballet for more than 25 years. As choreographer, Ms. Miller has created works for the Milwaukee Ballet, Milwaukee Ballet II, Central Pennsylvania Youth Ballet, Point Park University's International Summer Dance, Dance Arts Center and Erie Dance Conservatory.



## Principal Teacher LilaAnn Coates White

**LilaAnn Coates White** has been a part of Minnesota Ballet since she was twenty years old, as a company mem-

ber, Principal Teacher of Minnesota Ballet Academy, choreographer and rehearsal assistant for both the company and school, and Artistic Associate. Lila has worked under five artistic directors and has staged and rehearsed portions of The Nutcracker, Swan Lake, Coppélia, and Giselle. She has taught all levels of ballet and pointe as well as character, men's class, dance history, repertoire, and choreography workshops. To celebrate her 25th anniversary as Principal Teacher, Lila created a Grand Défilé for the Student performance and a Tribute to the Academy for the Ballet's 50th Anniversary Gala. Lila has choreographed numerous pieces for the Minnesota Ballet including "Precarious" and "Appasionato" and "Scenes from a Supper Club". Lila is an Assistant Professor of Dance at the University of Minnesota Duluth and holds a B.A. in Health Sciences and an M.A. in Physical Therapy.
